Ontario Small Business Support Grant	<ul> <li>Eligible small businesses include those that:         <ul> <li>Are required to close or significantly restrict services due to provincial shutdown imposed effective 12:01AM on December 26, 2020</li> <li>Have fewer than 100 employees at the enterprise level</li> <li>Have experienced a minimum 20% revenue decline in April 2020 compared to April 2019</li> </ul> </li> <li>Alternative months for comparing revenue decline exist for small businesses not in operation in April 2019 or April 2020.</li> <li>Businesses required to close prior to introduction of modified Stage 2 measures (October 10, 2020), and essential businesses permitted to operate with capacity restrictions, will not be eligible for grant</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Starting at \$10,000 for all eligible businesses, the grant will provide dollar for dollar funding to a maximum of \$20,000 to help cover decreased revenue expected as a result of the shutdown</li> </ul>	The application can be made <u>here</u>		
Property tax and energy cost rebates	<ul> <li>Businesses that are, or were, required to shut down or significantly restrict services due to provincial public health measures can apply for rebates, provided in the form of grants, to help with their fixed costs</li> </ul>	• Eligible businesses could get rebates for: (i) Municipal and education property tax; (ii) energy costs, including electricity and natural gas	The application can be made <u>here</u>		
Main Street Relief Grant: PPE Support	<ul> <li>To be eligible, the small business must have two to nineteen employees and be in one of the of the following sectors: retail, accommodation and food services, repair and maintenance, personal and laundry services, gyms and yoga studios, arts and entertainment and recreation.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>One-time grants of up to \$1,000</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The application can be made <u>here</u></li> </ul>		

Employer Health Tax (EHT) COVID-19 Energy Assistance Program – Small Business (CEAP-SB)	<ul> <li>Available to private-sector employers with annual payroll up to \$5 million</li> <li>Small business and registered charity electricity or natural gas customers meeting all criteria:         <ul> <li>Active account (within determined class) with an electricity distributor, a USMP or a natural gas distributor</li> <li>Has registered business number or charitable registration number</li> <li>The customer has overdue amounts owing from one or more electricity or gas bills since March 17, 2020.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Permanent increase to EHT exemption from \$490,000 to \$1 million for 2020</li> <li>Instalment threshold doubled from \$600,000 to \$1.2 million beginning with 2021 tax year</li> <li>Eligible Small business and registered charity customers may qualify for a one-time CEAP-SB credit for the electricity or natural gas charges that are overdue on the date of their application for CEAP-SB, up to a maximum of \$1,500</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>No action required</li> <li>Must apply for CEAP-SB through utility or USMP</li> </ul>
Pension contributi on deferral and extension	<ul> <li>For employer contributions to be eligible for deferral, plans must:         <ul> <li>Be single-employer, private-sector defined benefit pension plans</li> <li>Not already benefit from existing special relief measures</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Employers can elect to defer one or consecutive monthly payments of employer contributions due beginning October 1, 2020 and ending on March 31, 2021</li> <li>Deferred payments must be repaid with interest within specified timeframes</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Employers are required to file an election and schedule of payments with Financial Services Regulatory Authority of ON</li> <li>More information can be found <u>here</u></li> </ul>

From June 1 to October 31, 2020, time-of-use (TOU) electricity rates continued to be suspended, and customers will be billed on a new fixed Covid-19 Recovery Rate of \$0.128 per kilowatt hour. From January 1 to February 22, 2021, residential, farm and small business time-of- use customers paid the lowest rate (also known as the off-peak price) 24 hours a day.	•	No action needed; rate will automatically be applied to invoices

Ontario Tools Grant · New eligible apprentices	<ul> <li>The government is providing funding to help new eligible apprentices purchase the equipment they need to start their careers</li> <li>The funding amounts will be distributed as follows:         <ul> <li>\$1,000 for those in motive power sector trades;</li> <li>\$600 for those in construction and industrial sector trades;</li> <li>\$400 for those in service trades.</li> </ul> </li> <li>To be eligible for the new grant, apprentices must have:         <ul> <li>Completed level 1 training on or after April 1, 2020;</li> <li>An active registered training agreement;</li> <li>Been registered as an apprentice for at least 12 months.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
